Our Approach

Evidence Management Course

Improve the handling and processing of evidence in firearms-related crime scenes to reduce and combat impunity.

Interdicting Small Arms, Ammunition and Parts and Components

Boost the capacity of national authorities to reduce the diversion of small arms, ammunition, parts and components at entry-exit points through x-ray identification.

Arms Trade Treaty Implementation Course

Bolster the capability of national control authorities to improve global and regional transfer controls in conventional arms (import, export, transit, trans-shipment and brokering).

Inter-institutional Training Course on Combating Illicit Firearms, Ammunition and Explosives (IITC)

Provide the law enforcement community with theoretical and practical tools to prevent and combat the illicit trafficking in firearms, ammunition and explosives.
